Wolf Cub Leaders: Please use this guide to help your cub scouts fulfill requirements toward earning badges. All of the requirements listed below can be done at the Saint Louis Science Center at your leisure. We have listed the name of the badge first, followed by the name of the particular requirement(s) that can be completed and the location within the Science Center, if applicable. It is our hope that you and your scouts have fun exploring the Science Center and earning badges.

BE SAFE AT HOME AND ON THE STREET

Responsibility - Saint Louis Science Center

How does being responsible help us to be safe in public places? Before you come to the Saint Louis Science Center with your scout group or family, talk with an adult about how you can act responsibly when visiting the Science Center. Reflect on the responsible things you did while visiting the Science Center and how you can be responsible everyday.

Practice good safety rules - Saint Louis Science Center

When walking outside you have to be careful, especially in parking lots. Visit the Saint Louis Science Center and practice good safety rules when walking to and from your car.

COMPUTERS

What do computers do? - Cyberville Gallery

Start in the Cyberville Gallery to see how people use computers when they visit the Saint Louis Science Center. Then ask a gallery staff member how computers are helpful to the employees of the Science Center. Computers help generate schedules, reports and even keep the exhibits working!

FAMILY FUN

Plan a walk - Forest Park

When visiting the Saint Louis Science Center, park in Forest Park near the James S. McDonnell Planetarium and walk to the museum. You can also get a good walk inside the museum! Plan a route so that you can walk through the science center and see everything!

Read a book - Saint Louis Science Center and Planetarium

There are several locations at the Saint Louis Science Center where your family can curl up with a good book about science! Books can be found in the Planetarium, on the bridge, near the dinosaurs and outside the Discovery Room. Pick one and settle in to read with your family.

Attend a live program with your family - Demo Lab and Center Stage

Staff members at the Saint Louis Science Center regularly put on live science demonstrations and sometimes they need help from the audience! Look for fun presentations at the Amazing Science Demo Lab and at Center Stage. Science Center staff members can help direct you to these locations and let you know what fun demonstrations are planned for the day.

FEATS OF SKILL

Walk a line - Human Adventure Gallery

Practice walking the balance beam in the Human Adventure Gallery. Test yourself by looking in the mirror while you try to walk the beam.

IT'S A SECRET

Use a secret code - Cyberville Gallery

Computer use a code of 1s and 0s to communicate with each other, but it doesn't have to be a secret to you! Head to the Cyberville Gallery to learn about binary math and ASCII codes.

OUTDOOR ADVENTURE

Plan a picnic - Forest Park

The next time you visit the Saint Louis Science Center, pack a picnic lunch. There are good spots outside the James S. McDonald Planetarium to relax and enjoy a lunch with your friends and family.

PLAY A GAME

Play group games - Science Park

Bring your den or pack to Science Park and play large group games lead by someone from your group.

Make and fly a paper bag kite - Forest Park

Bring your kites to the Science Center; you can test them out in Forest Park by the Science Center's Science Park.

START A COLLECTION

Make a collection - Ecology and Environment Past Gallery

Look at the collections in the Ecology and Environment Past Gallery and the Paleontology Lab. How are they organized? What information is on the labels? Why is that information important? Build a collection of your own (or use one you already have) and make an organization system that works for you.
